Position Summary	Central Mchigan University invites applications for three faculty positions in the Department of Earth and Atmospheric Sciences. Two appointments will be at the rank of tenure-track Assistant Professor. One appointment will be at the rank of tenured full Professor to serve as Department Chair. We are seeking candidates who use a combination of fieldwork, large data set analysis, and modeling to address environmental problems. Preference will be given to candidates with expertise in one or more of the following areas: biogeochemical cycling, stable isotope geochemistry, land/atmosphere interactions, sedimentology/geomorphology, the use of geophysical techniques in environmental research, and other areas of environmental science pertinent to the Great Lakes region.
Required Qualifications	Ph.D. in environmental sciences, geological sciences, or a related field. Successful candidates will be expected to support the undergraduate environmental science and geology programs, enhance graduate education by actively supervising Ph.D. candidates, and become active members of the Institute for Great Lakes Research. Successful candidates for the rank of Assistant Professor should have a record of publishing in quality journals and have a commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching and graduate education. These Assistant Professors will be expected to develop and maintain an externally funded research program involving undergraduate and graduate students. Preference will be given to candidates who have a demonstrated record of receiving external funding. The initial teaching load will be three courses per academic year, for up to five years based on satisfactory progress towards establishing a funded research program. Beyond the probationary period teaching load will depend on the level of external support. Additional responsibilities include departmental, college, and university service. Candidates for the Department Chair position should have an outstanding record of publishing and external funding as well as a strong evidence of effective leadership in an academic setting. The successful applicant will be expected to develop and maintain an externally funded research program involving undergraduate and graduate students and post-doctoral researchers. Ideally, the successful candidate, as an accomplished environmental geoscientist, will use a multi-disciplinary approach to research, demonstrate excellent interpersonal and communication skills, provide a vision for strengthening the department and oversee the launch of the environmental science program. Additional responsibilities include teaching 2 courses per academic year and university and departmental screen program.
