

Graduate Research Assistant in Resource Economics at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore

The NOAA Living Marine Resources Cooperative Science Center (LMRCSC) at University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) seeks a master's level graduate student in Resource Economics for the Fall 2016 semester. The student will join the research group of Dr. Yeong Nain Chi. New graduate students applying to UMES and current graduate students will be considered.

The goal of this research group is to enhance the knowledge, quantitative, communication, and leadership skills required to obtain careers in Resource Economics with a focus on fisheries management and conservation. Currently, we are conducting analysis on tournament anglers' expenditure data, and estimating the economic impact of offshore fishing tournaments in Ocean City, Maryland.

Qualified scholars are offered a stipend of \$18,000 plus tuition remission. Applicants must be US citizens majoring in economics, agribusiness, environmental sciences, natural sciences, or related field.
