The University of Arkansas in Fayetteville is conducting a Research Experience for Undergraduates during the summer of 2017 for undergraduates not enrolled in summer coursework.

This REU focuses on field- and lab-based research in areas including watershed management, biofuels, sustainability and more. Projects are supervised by UA Faculty and vary from year to year based on the most current work being conducted at UA.

This program provides specific opportunities for Native American students. Other under-represented groups, as well as all students interested in environmental science fields are encouraged to apply.

The **10-week program** consists of weekly seminars and mentor suppers, a research experience, and an intensive component on data analysis and presentation. Cohort-building exercises include canoeing and camping in the Ozarks, waterfall hikes, and Pow-Wow attendance. All projects result in a student-sourced manuscript and formal presentation at a professional meeting. **Funding from the National Science Foundation provides each student: room and board at UA in addition to a \$5500 stipend.**
