

The Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation Emerging Postdoctoral Entrepreneur Award

About the Award

Entrepreneurial postdoctoral scholars benefit society and the economy when they bring their research to market.

The **Kauffman Foundation Emerging Postdoctoral Entrepreneur Award**, established by the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation and the National Postdoctoral Association (NPA), encourages entrepreneurial excellence in the scientific community. The annual award recognizes a postdoctoral scholar who exhibits exceptional commitment to entrepreneurship and the potential to commercialize his or her research in a way that benefits society. The 2011 award—a \$2,500 honorarium—will be presented during the NPA's 9th Annual Meeting, to be held March 25-27, 2011, in Bethesda, Md.

Eligibility for Nomination

Self-nomination is allowed and encouraged. To be eligible for nomination, the entrepreneur must:

- Hold a PhD in a field of science.
- Hold a postdoctoral position in the United States or have completed postdoctoral training in the United States.
- Be a member of the National Postdoctoral Association (NPA).
- Be actively seeking to commercialize his/her intellectual property or working as a founding partner to commercialize others' intellectual property.

Please note: Kauffman Entrepreneur Postdoctoral Fellows are not eligible to apply.

Submission of Nominations

1. Nominations may be submitted electronically via the NPA Web site www.nationalpostdoc.org/emerging-award or e-mailed to entrepreneur@nationalpostdoc.org. Nominations will be closed after September 27, 2010, at 11:59 p.m. EDT.
2. Upon receipt of the nomination, the NPA will contact the nominee with instructions for application.
3. The nominee should complete the application form, attach the required supporting documents, and submit the application form and documents digitally, as per the instructions. The nominee also may mail printed nomination forms and documents via the United States Post Office to:

4. **The deadline for electronic submission of applications is 11:59 p.m. EDT, Monday, October 4, 2010. Mailed applications should be postmarked no later than October 4, 2010. Later postmarks will automatically disqualify the candidate.**

Judging

The Selection Committee is comprised of leaders in the postdoctoral community, NPA leaders, and business and science leaders who have entrepreneurial expertise. The recipient of the 2010 Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation Emerging Postdoctoral Entrepreneur Award also will serve on the committee.

There will be three rounds of judging:

1. The NPA staff will review the applications for completeness of information and nominee eligibility. Incomplete applications will be disqualified, as will applications from nominees who do not meet the eligibility criteria.
2. The Selection Committee will review and score eligible applications quantitatively, awarding points based upon, but not limited to, the role of the nominee and the nominee's research in the company; patents received; the product(s); and, financial information, including the amount, type and number of investments. The top-scoring nominees will become finalists.
3. Finalists' applications will be reviewed at length in light of the value of their entrepreneurship to society and the potential impact of their technical innovations on the world. The nominee's record of leadership, mentoring and community service also will be considered.

The award recipient will be notified of his/her selection by January 31, 2011, to allow him/her time to arrange to attend the award ceremony at the NPA's 9th Annual Meeting (required).

Benefits

In addition to the honorarium, the recipient will enjoy several other award benefits, including but not limited to:

- Media coverage via news releases distributed by the Kauffman Foundation and NPA.
- Articles featuring the recipient in Kauffman Foundation and NPA publications.
- National recognition at the NPA's 9th Annual Meeting in Bethesda, Md., March 25-27, 2011.
- Opportunity to serve on the 2012 award selection committee.

About the 2010 Award Recipient

Dr. Antonio Webb, a postdoctoral researcher at Northwestern University and co-founder of VesselTek Biomedical, an Evanston, Ill.-based vascular products company, was named the 2010 Emerging Postdoctoral Entrepreneur. He earned his bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from Colorado School of Mines, and his master's and PhD in biomedical engineering from Northwestern University. Dr. Webb has served as principal investigator on National Science Foundation and National Institutes of Health small business innovation research grants and currently is working to develop controlled drug eluting vascular grafts and perivascular wraps to prevent neointimal hyperplasia and thrombosis associated with vascular injury.

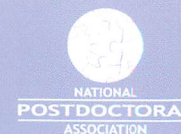
