



The School of Meteorology (<https://ou.edu/ags/meteorology>) at the University of Oklahoma invite applications for an Unranked Renewable Term faculty position focused on teaching. The School is housed within the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Sciences. Qualifications

Applicants must possess an M.S. or Ph.D. in Meteorology, Atmospheric Science, or a related discipline at the time of appointment and possess a record of experience indicating high potential for teaching excellence at the University of Oklahoma. The candidate will be expected to teach up to 3 courses per semester, to develop and teach courses of programmatic need, to broadly participate in the development of new curricula, and to participate in intramural and extramural service.

Application Instructions

To apply, submit as one single pdf document a comprehensive cover letter (not to exceed 10 pages), current curriculum vitae or resumé, and a list of at least 3 people who can serve as references to the link here: <http://apply.interfolio.com/163576>. The cover letter may address the candidate's approach to teaching (e.g., past instructional and mentorship experiences, and plans/goals for teaching at the University of Oklahoma including existing and proposed courses), service (e.g., a vision for internal service to the academic unit, the College and the University, and for external service to our scientific community and other stakeholders), and student mentorship.

Screening of applications will begin on March 14, 2025 and continue until the position is filled.
